STATE AND WARATAH LEAGUE REGULATIONS

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STATE LEAGUE AND WARATAH LEAGUE COMPETITION RULES

1. THE COMPETITION

- 1.1 The Softball NSW State League and Waratah League Competitions will be conducted under the auspices of, and governed by, the Rules and Regulations of Softball NSW.
- 1.2 The State League and Waratah League competitions will be conducted in four (4) divisions – Male State League and Waratah League, and Female State League and Waratah League.
- 1.3 The object of State League is to be the premier competition for softball in New South Wales. The object of Waratah League is to provide a platform for players to develop to play in State League.
- 1.4 State League and Waratah League will be conducted at Blacktown International Sports Park and other venues selected by SNSW.
- 1.5 Games will be scheduled on Friday nights and Sundays.
- 1.6 The draw will be made available to all participating teams prior to the start of the competition.
- 1.7 Individual awards (Batting Award, Most Valuable Player, Pitcher of the Series & Rookie of the Year) will be presented for each State League division.

Please note rookie players on the team roster.
- 1.8 Softball NSW will be responsible for the administration, development and promotion of State League and Waratah League.
- 1.9 The Softball NSW Office will provide administrative support for State League and Waratah League.
- 1.10 Softball NSW will ensure that a Softball NSW Representative (or Appointee) is in attendance at each game and who will be the sole arbiter on matters pertaining to these regulations.

2. REGISTERING A TEAM

FOR 2020 COMPETITIONS THE FOLLOWING TIMELINE WILL BE OBSERVED DUE TO EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES:

- Teams are asked to submit an Expression of Interest by 5pm Sunday July 12 to indicate their intention to participate in the League. However, this will not be a registration requirement for 2020.
 - Teams may register by 20 July. There will be no cap on the number of teams or requirement to lodge an expression of interest for 2020 competitions.
 - A draw will be issued by 31 July.
 - Uniform details must be provided by 31 July.
 - Competition will commence 9 August.
- 2.1 Clubs or Associations may register teams following an invitation from Softball NSW as set out in the following procedure.
- 2.2 Clubs or Associations may submit an expression of interest to enter a team in State League and/or in Waratah League no later than 2 months prior to commencement.
- 2.3 An expression of interest must include a list of players who intend to play for the team that is invited to enter the division for which they have nominated, and the proposed team staff.
- 2.4 No more than 2 weeks after the closing date for expressions of interest, Softball NSW will issue an invitation to each club to enter a team in State League and/or Waratah League, having regard to:
- The skills and experience of the players who intend to play for the team, especially Softball NSW representation and National representation;
 - The past performance of the club; and
 - The object of each League.
- 2.5 No more than six (6) teams may be registered for State League in each the male and female divisions.
- 2.6 No later than one month prior to commencement, team lists must be submitted for each team including a minimum of twelve (12) players and a minimum of three (3) officials (Head Coach, Assistant Coach and Manager) on each team sheet submitted prior to the commencement of the competition.

3. ELIGIBILITY

3.1 Every participant must be:

- (a) A current registered member of a Softball NSW Full Affiliated Association. However, participants do not need to be registered with the same Association where their team is based, whether that team is entered by a Club or Association

OR

- (b) A current registered member of a state affiliated with Softball Australia. An interstate team member (player/official) shall be required to pay a competition fee of thirty-three dollars (\$33) per team member through a Softball NSW "State League Interstate Registration Form" and a SAL Permit to be completed for each interstate player/official via the Sports TG (national registration) database. Permits are to be completed no later than 5.00pm on the Thursday prior to the first game in which the player/official participates in.

3.2 Players must be at least sixteen (16) years of age as at December 31 in the year of the competition to participate in State League.

3.3 Players must be at least sixteen (16) years of age as at December 31 in the year of the competition to participate in Waratah League, or have been selected to participate in the U16 State Camp in the year of the competition. FOR 2020 ONLY PLAYERS WHO ARE AT LEAST FOURTEEN (14) YEARS OF AGE AND WHO NOMINATE FOR SELECTION IN A SNSW U16 STATE TEAM WILL BE ELIGIBLE TO PLAY IN WARATAH LEAGUE.

3.4 The following are ineligible for Waratah League:

- Players who have participated in Open or U23 National Championships in the three (3) years ending on 31 December in the year of the competition;
- Players who have represented Australia in the five (5) years ending on 31 December in the year of the competition, or three (3) years ending on the same date for players who represented Australia in a junior team; and
- Players who have participated in State League for three (3) consecutive years. For the purpose of this rule, a player who registered in Waratah League for a season will be treated as having participated in State League if more than 50% of the games in that season in which they were on the team list were State League games.

3.5 Any one State League team may register no more than eight (8) current Open State/Interstate team members as players.

3.6 Players and Officials must be involved with only *one* team in a division of the competition.

- 3.7 All participants must be included on a team roster prior to involvement in any State League game.
- 3.8 Players may register for a team in either State League or Waratah League. If a player is registered to play Waratah League for a club or Association that also has a State League team, that player may participate in either division in any given week but may not participate in both divisions in the same week. Players must be at least sixteen (16) years of age at 31 December in the year of the competition to If a person plays in both State League and Waratah League in the same week, the club at fault will forfeit all games in which the player participated in that week.

NOTE: *For information on Forfeits & Penalties for failure to comply with eligibility criteria see Rule 16*

4. TEAM ROSTERS

- 4.1 Additions to team rosters will be accepted 1 hour prior to the teams scheduled game/s on any day for player/official participates. This person must be a registered member of a full affiliate of Softball NSW or a current registered member of SAL through an Inter-State Softball Association. The player/official must be in full team uniform to be able to participate in any game. The registration status of the player/official will be checked by the Softball NSW office. The addition to roster form needs to be handed to the Softball NSW Representative if the player is added on the day of play.
- 4.2 A maximum of eighteen (18) players can be registered on a team roster. Players cannot be deregistered once the competition has commenced.
- 4.3 All Head Coaches for State League must be at least Performance Coaching/Level 4 accredited and all other Coaches for State League and Waratah League must be at least Foundation Coaching/Level 3 accredited.
- 4.4 Head Coaches are not permitted to participate as a player in the League in which they are coaching.
- 4.5 A person may only register as the Head Coach of a team in one division. A person may be registered as the Head Coach of a team in one division and an Assistant Coach of a team in the other division.
- 4.6 Working With Children Checks (WWCC) are required for all Team Officials.

5. MATCH BALLS

- 5.1 Competing teams will be required to provide a minimum of 2 match balls each for each game in which they are playing.
- 5.2 Match balls must be Easton 888.

6. RESULT SHEETS – LINE UP PADS

- 6.1 Softball NSW will supply one Line Up pad for the season for each team.
- 6.2 A line up sheet containing a list of all players and officials must be completed, in triplicate, by both teams at least thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of the game. The team name is to be clearly printed on top of the line up sheet. One copy is to be given to the plate umpire, one copy to the opposing team and one copy to the Official Scorer
- 6.3 The uniform number, family and given name of every participant must be legibly printed on the line up sheet. No nicknames or initials are permitted.
- 6.4 At the conclusion of the game the plate umpire shall enter the final game score and sign both of the line up sheets. The Plate Umpire shall return the line up sheets to the Umpire in Chief (UIC).

7. OFFICIAL SCORERS

- 7.1 Official Scorers, one for each game, will be provided by the SNSW Scorers & Statisticians.
- 7.2 The Official Scorers will be responsible for completing the statistic sheets required by the Softball NSW Selection Committee.
- 7.3 At the conclusion of the competition each team will be provided with a complete set of their statistics.

8. UMPIRES

FOR 2020 ALL UMPIRES WILL BE NOMINATED AND APPOINTED BY SNSWUA.

- 8.1 Umpires for State League will be nominated by SNSWUA.
- 8.2 Waratah League teams must make one umpire available for the whole of each day of competition in which that team is participating. SNSWUA will provide a list or minimum level of umpires who are required for State League no more than two weeks prior to the commencement of the season and Waratah League teams may not nominate umpires on that list.
- 8.2 SNSWUA will identify and notify the Softball NSW Office of an UIC for each round. SNSWUA may also nominate any number of Deputy Umpires in Chief who will share the responsibilities of the UIC at the discretion of the UIC.
- 8.3 The UIC will allocate umpires to games.
- 8.4 Umpires are required to report to the UIC thirty (30) minutes prior to the scheduled game time.

8.5 The UIC will deal with each protest, other than on matters of player eligibility, at the time it is lodged.

9. INCLEMENT WEATHER

9.1 If it is necessary to cancel games prior to a weekend, this will be done by Softball NSW by 3:00pm on Friday. All team contacts will be notified of the decision by 7:00 pm on that day.

9.2 Where teams are travelling in excess of 100 kilometres, they are required to inform the Softball NSW Representative on the Thursday prior to the competition games of their scheduled departure time.

9.3 It is the responsibility of the Softball NSW Representative and the UIC to determine whether games will be played on the day of competition.

9.4 The Softball NSW Representative is responsible for notifying all teams competing at their venue of any cancellations by 7.30am on the day of competition.

9.5 Once a game commences the decision to suspend that game will be the responsibility of the plate umpire who may consult with the UIC.

9.6 Any game called off, that does not satisfy Rule 18.4, will be declared a draw. Any game that did not commence due to inclement weather, will be declared a draw, unless rescheduled in accordance with Rule 9.7.

9.7 Softball NSW reserves the right to schedule make-up games when round games are washed out.

10. PLAYING RULES

10.1 All games shall be played in accordance with the current Softball Australia Rules as adopted by Softball NSW unless otherwise specified hereafter.

10.2 All games shall commence at the time specified in the draw unless delayed by the previous game. A minimum of thirty (30) minutes shall be allowed between games.

10.3 If any team is not ready to play at the appointed time, this will result in forfeit to the non-offending team.

10.4 Any team that does not have the required number of players to begin or continue a game will forfeit to the non-offending team.

10.5 Uniforms are the responsibility of the team manager.

10.6 Jewellery

Distracting Adornments – no exposed items, including jewellery, judged by the umpire to be distracting to opposing players may be worn or displayed.

The umpire shall require the item to be removed or covered. Medical alert bracelets and/or necklaces, if deemed distracting shall be required to be taped to the body in such a manner that the medical alert information remains visible.

Please Note: The player will not be allowed to take the field if these rules are not adhered to.

10.7 The first named team in the draw shall occupy first base bench and shall call the toss. Each team shall be entitled to five (5) minutes warm-up on the diamond prior to the scheduled starting time.

10.8 A Designated Runner (DR) may be used in any game for any baserunner provided it is made known prior to the commencement of the game **and** the name of the DR is entered in the DR position on the line up pad.

10.9 The DR may enter the game **once** in **each inning** to run for any baserunner.

EXCEPTION: the DR may run for the catcher if the catcher is on base after the second out of an inning, in addition to running one other time that inning.

10.10 Any baserunner replaced by the DR returns to the game upon completion of the inning **or** at their next turn at bat, whichever occurs first.

10.11 The DR may not enter the game on defence **or** as a batter.

10.12 The DR may be substituted for at any time by a substitute who has not yet been in the game, in accordance with the official rules of Softball.

10.13 The original DR may re-enter the game, once, in accordance with the official rules of Softball. A player who has been in the game as a substitute for the DR may not re-enter or play as a substitute in any other position in the line-up.

10.14 The penalty for an illegal DR is the ejection of both the Head Coach and the player in violation.

10.15 Should the catcher from the last defensive inning be on base after the defensive team makes the second out, he/she must be replaced by a Temporary Runner who is any eligible player who is not in the next four positions, i.e. bench player, DR etc.

10.16 **INTENTIONAL WALK RULE**

Each team playing may only use the Intentional Walk rule once per game. The Plate Umpire officiating in each match shall take note as to when each team uses their one permitted Intentional Walk per match and shall disallow any further requests by the defensive team to use the Intentional Walk.

10.17 A maximum of sixteen (16) players may be on the team list and participate in any one game. Should this number be exceeded the team at fault will forfeit to the non-offending team.

10.18 Each team's Head Coach must be in attendance at every game. Should the Head Coach not be in attendance this will result in the loss of points awarded for that particular game, unless a written explanation, as allowed in Rule 10.19, is accepted by SNSW.

10.19 Teams who violate Rule 10.18 have until 5.00pm on the Monday following the game(s) in question to provide a written explanation to the Softball NSW Office for consideration by SNSW.

NOTE: Notification of non-attendance at games may be submitted prior to the games in question **AND** if nominating a replacement coach who satisfies Rule 4.5 this must be notified to the Softball NSW Office in writing by 5.00pm on the Wednesday prior to the game in which the replacement coach will participate.

10.20 At least fifteen (15) minutes prior to the scheduled starting time the toss shall be taken by the team managers / representatives.

(a) The team batting first in the game has the first use of the diamond. Its time shall start twelve (12) minutes prior to the start time and expire seven (7) minutes prior to start time.

(b) The second team warming up shall stay on the diamond for the start of the game.

(c) The Home Plate Meeting shall occur two (2) minutes prior to the scheduled start time.

10.21 The seven (7) run ahead rule will apply after five (5) innings in all games including the Final Series.

The ten (10) run ahead rule will apply after four (4) innings in all games including the Final Series.

The fifteen (15) run ahead rule will apply after three (3) innings in all games including the Final Series.

10.22 If a regulation game has not been completed in 2 hours, the game will conclude at the end of the inning in progress. A new inning will not commence after one hour and 55 minutes.

10.23 A tiebreaker will be played if, at the conclusion of a regulation game, the score is equal, and the game time has not exceeded 1 hour and 55 minutes. A second tiebreaker will be played if the score is equal at the end of the 8th inning and the game time has not exceeded 1 hour and 55 minutes.

10.24 Metal cleats may be worn at Blacktown International Sports Park. Softball NSW will advise whether metal cleats are permitted at other venues.

11. UNIFORMS

- 11.1 A "State League/Waratah League Team Uniform Form" must be completed and sent to the SNSW Office with the Final Team Roster Form.
- 11.2 No items of Softball NSW or Australian team uniforms or other items bearing a Softball NSW or Australian team logo are to be worn, including undershirts and batting helmets. To avoid doubt, a Softball NSW or Australian team logo may not be obscured with tape or any other substance.
- 11.3 All socks, belts and undershirts must be of the one team colour.
- 11.4 Batting helmets must all be the same colour.
- 11.5 Officials uniform must be team colours. Jeans or lycra, in any form, are not allowed to be worn by officials.
- 11.6 Players and officials will not be allowed to take the field if they are not in the uniform indicated in the State League Team Uniform Form or if they are otherwise in breach of any of these rules relating to uniforms.

12. EJECTION OF PLAYERS/OFFICIALS

- 12.1 Should any player/official be ejected from a game for any form of misconduct the umpire concerned shall submit a written report to the UIC immediately after the conclusion of the game in question.
- 12.2 Every player/official ejected from a game for any form of misconduct shall appear before a Tribunal, convened in accordance with SNSW's Disciplinary Regulations.
- 12.3 The UIC shall advise the Softball NSW Representative of the need to call a Tribunal Hearing.
- 12.4 The Softball NSW Representative shall advise the player/official **and** the umpire who ejected the participant of the time and place of the Tribunal Hearing which shall be conducted as close as possible to the end of the game in question.
- 12.5 The player/official who was ejected shall not be eligible to participate further in any State League or Waratah game until they have appeared before a Tribunal.
- 12.6 The UIC shall notify the Softball NSW Representative of any suspensions prior to the next fixture (i.e. If a Tribunal occurs on Saturday notification is to be given to the Softball NSW Representative prior to Sunday of the same weekend).

13. DESIGNATED TEAM AREA

- 13.1 If a club has a team entered in each State League and Waratah League, players from either team may be present in the designated team area at any time provided that they are in uniform and do not create a disturbance or impediment to the game.
- 13.2 The designated team area includes the dugout, the bullpen, and the area between the dugout and seating for spectators. FOR 2020, THE DESIGNATED TEAM AREA WILL BE EXPANDED FOR THE PURPOSE OF SOCIAL DISTANCING. Details will be provided for each host venue.

14. POINTS

- 14.1 Points for round games will be allocated as follows:

3	Win
2	Draw
2	Inclement Weather/Cancellations
1	Loss
0	Forfeit

15. DETERMINING TIED POSITIONS - FINAL PLACINGS

- 15.1 If two or more teams are tied on points, the team with the least runs against for the entire round robin shall take the higher ladder position.
- 15.2 If two teams are tied on points, the higher ladder position will be determined by the first of the following that determines a result:
1. runs against
 2. the team that won the first head to head game in the round robin
 3. runs against in all games played between the two teams
 4. a playoff game to determine who takes the higher position.
- 15.3 If three teams are tied on points and runs against, the head-to-head results played between those three teams shall be considered. If one team has won more matches against the other two teams it is tied with, this team shall take the higher ladder position. The next two ladder positions would be decided as per 15.2
- 15.4 In the case that three or more teams are tied on points and runs against and the teams can't be separated by the head-to-head results in the round robin, the positions will be determined by the number of runs against in the head-to-head games between all teams which finished equal on points.
- 15.5 If these teams are still tied (three or more teams tied on points, runs against, can't be separated by head-to-head result and are tied on points and runs against) then the teams that are tied shall play off, in a series of games determined by SNSW, to determine final placings.

16. FORFEITS & PENALTIES

- 16.1 Payment of all fines imposed must be submitted to the Softball NSW office by 5.00pm on the Friday following the game in question. Failure of a team to pay said fines by the time specified will result in the loss of all future game points until the payment is received. (Note: the lost points are NOT reinstated on payment of fine.)
- 16.2 **Withdrawal from Competition:** Teams have until four weeks prior to the competition to withdraw without penalty. Should a team withdraw from the League after this date all monies submitted in relation to the League will be forfeited. FOR 2020 ONLY THE DEADLINE TO WITHDRAW WITHOUT PENALTY WILL BE ONE WEEK PRIOR TO THE COMPETITION.
- 16.3 Following notification of acceptance into the State League or Waratah League Competition and prior to the commencement of the competition, any team failing to pay the balance of the entry fee by the due date will automatically have their team withdrawn from the competition AND forfeit all monies paid to date.
- 16.4 The participation of an unregistered/ineligible player/official will result in the forfeiture of the game in which the unregistered/ineligible player/official participated.
- 16.5 If an ejected player/official takes part in any game prior to appearing before a State League Tribunal, this will automatically result in the forfeiture of all games in which the ejected player/official has participated.
- 16.6 Should a player/official who has been suspended by a State League Tribunal take part in any game this will automatically result in the forfeiture of all games in which the suspended player/official has participated.
- 16.7 A player or official who takes part in a game in breach of Rule 16.5 or 16.6 will be charged with an offence which will be heard by a Tribunal.

17. APPEALS

Appeals against any forfeiture must be submitted in writing no later than 3 days after the event/game. Any appeal received after 3 days will not be considered by the SNSW Appeals Committee.

18. DANGEROUS CONDITIONS

- 18.1 The Plate Umpire shall suspend a game if the conditions are dangerous or unplayable. It is the responsibility of the Plate Umpire and does not require the UIC's consent.
- 18.2 The UIC and/or the Softball NSW Representative may direct the Plate Umpire to suspend a game.

- 18.3 Once the Plate Umpire has suspended a game, the UIC and/or the Softball NSW Representative may:
- resume that game if the conditions warrant or
 - abandon that game if the conditions remain dangerous or unplayable.
- 18.4 When any round game in progress is called off it shall be considered a regulation game provided 50% of allotted time has elapsed OR a minimum of five (5) innings have been played. Any game called off before such time shall be declared a draw.
- 18.5 Any game called off, that does not satisfy Rule 18.4, or any game that did not commence due to inclement weather, will be declared a draw, subject to Rule 9.7.

19. FINAL SERIES

ELIGIBILITY

- 19.1 Players must participate in **50% of the games** played by their team to be eligible for the final series. This does not include games that are washed out or the game is forfeited prior to its commencement.
- 19.2 Participants with Softball Australia commitments may gain exemption from Rule 19.1 by making written application to the Softball NSW by 5.00pm on the Wednesday prior to the Softball Australia commitment. Such exemption will only be granted if:
- a. the player participated in at least 12.5% of the games scheduled for their team;
 - b. the player would have participated in 25% of the games scheduled for their team but for the player's Softball Australia commitments; and
 - c. the player provides reasons that they were not able to attend other games so as to comply with Rule 19.1.
- 19.3 If a player has participated in both State League and Waratah League, they will be eligible to play in the finals only for the division in which they played the greater number of games.

GENERAL

- 19.4 The highest ranked team in each game of the final series will have the choice of being the home or away team. The home team will field first and occupy the third base dugout. The away team will bat first and occupy the first base dugout.
- 19.5 In the event that competition rounds are not completed, the final series will be held, and individual prizes awarded provided that **50% of teams have played 50% of their scheduled games.**
- 19.6 Competitions in which six (6) or more teams have entered, will have a 4-team finals series, with the playoffs in the format:

Semi Final	Team 1 v Team 2	(Game A)
	Team 3 v Team 4	(Game B)
Preliminary Final	Loser A v Winner B	(Game C)
Grand Final	Winner A v Winner C	

Softball NSW reserves the right to determine the final series play offs for competitions in which less than six (6) teams are entered.

FINAL SERIES – UNABLE TO BE PLAYED

19.7 In a competition of six (6) or more teams, in the event that any Finals Series Match (or matches) is COMPLETELY unplayed the following will apply:

a. Unplayable Semi Final(s):

Team 1 through to Grand Final.

Teams 2 and 3 to play Preliminary Final

Team 4 drops out

b. Unplayable Preliminary Final:

Highest ranked team through to Grand Final

c. Unplayable Grand Final

JOINT WINNERS will be declared.

19.8 **If the FINAL SERIES is unable to be played the winner shall be the winner of the preliminary rounds.**

FINAL SERIES GAMES

19.9 All final series games shall be regulation games.

19.10 During a final series game if the final game score is a draw, this game will continue until a result is obtained with the Tie Breaker commencing at the beginning of the 8th inning.

19.11 If any game during the final series is called off due to inclement weather and five (5) or more innings have been completed or the team second at bat has scored more runs than the other team in five (5) innings, it will be considered a regulation game.

19.12 Should a game during the final series (except the grand final) be called off in circumstances where clause 19.11 is not satisfied or the result is a draw, the result will be determined according to ranking of the teams at the start of the final series. If the grand final cannot be completed, and Rule 19.11 is not satisfied, joint winners will be declared.

20. ADMINISTRATION

- 20.2 All cheques pertaining to State League or Waratah League should be made payable to Softball NSW Inc. or payment by direct debit to the Softball NSW Inc. nominated account.
- 20.3 All accounts must be settled through the Softball NSW Office. No monies will be accepted at competition venues.

21. DISCLAIMER

Notwithstanding the above rules and regulations, Softball NSW Inc retains the right to rule on any matter not specifically covered by the State League and Waratah League rules and to take action on decisions pertaining to the League subject to the right of appeal to Softball NSW.

22. SNSW POLICIES AND CODES OF CONDUCT

Softball NSW has numerous Policies in particular, the SNSW Member Protection Policy and Codes of Conduct that all State League and Waratah League participants must adhere to.
